GATEWAY OF INDIA

What could be more appropriate a beginning than the 'Entrance' to the port of Mumbai. The ceremonial are commemorate the visit of king George V and Queen Mary for the Delhi Durban in 1911. Historically the significance as the last of the British troops left Independent India by sea marched through its portals.





A magnificent building completed in 1888, the Victoria terminus was named after the then queen empress (Queen Victoria) on Jubliee day 1887. Construction started in 1878 based on a design by FW Steven, and took 10 years to complete. The cost of construction was Rs. 16.14 lakhs (Rs.1.614 Million). The railway station was opened to the public on New Year's Day 1882. It is now the starting point of the Central Railways

JEHANGIR ART GALLERY

Close by to the Prince of Wales museum this gallery is the showcase for contemporary art. The displays change is the Artist's plaza with more painting on display and safe.

MAHATMA JYOTIBA PHULE MARKET (Crawford Market)

CHOWPATI BEACH

MAHALAXMI TEMPLE

HAJI ALI MOSQUE
